



Community based organizations (CBOs) are on the frontlines to tackle social and health inequities in Chicago.

Data is very important for CBOs to determine what issues they should address and how to support their communities.

The Chicagoland CEAL Program wanted to find out more about the data needs, goals, and supports for CBOs in Chicago.

Surveys

- 51 surveys done in summer 2023
- Most respondents held leadership roles
- Surveys asked about:
 - Organizational budget
 - Data use
 - Data goals
 - Funding
 - Population-level data
 - Data Platforms

Interviews

- 24 of 51 survey respondents were interviewed in fall 2023
- Resulted in more detailed answers about data needs

Results and Solutions

Increase long-term funding for CBOs



Make CBO funding less restrictive

Staff Funding

- Only 4% of CBOs had sufficient funding for data-related work
- 38% of CBOs had a dedicated data-related staff member

Let CBOs allocate their own funding



Data Use vs. Goals

- Funders require data that isn't always useful to CBOs
 - CBOs collect more data than they need → overworked staff
 - CBOs want action-focused data

CBO data needs should be prioritized by funders

Inaccessibility of Data Systems

- Data platforms are outdated and hard to use
- Data not hyperlocal enough
- Multiple databases to satisfy all funders → requires double data entry

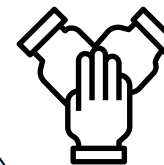
Funders should increase qualitative data measures
